

Isaiah  
Chapter 34

v. 14-15--(con't) Owls have a habit of inhabiting bird's abandoned nests. When we vacate our hearts of the constant companionship of Jesus, owls (representative of Satan's influence, whether in small or large amounts of influence) will move in and nest, and these influences will grow if our hearts aren't occupied with the things of God and the Fruits of the Spirit.

v. 16-17-- God challenges His people to look in His Book, and find His promises and assures us that every one He will keep. These are beautiful verses of reassurance for us. Everything in His Word will find her mate in reality, for everything God says will come about!! He commands it, and the Holy Spirit brings it about in our lives. In v. 17 He tells of the sacrifice Jesus made to bring us these promises, and how much of it was fulfilled, line by line, in His time on earth, and all of that is given to us, and to our descendents, as we dwell in Him!!

Chapter 35

v. 1-5-- These are such beautiful verses! They are a vivid description of our strength, peace, joy, and protection through Jesus Christ!

v. 6-7-- The Living Waters will overflow our parched lives and produce such joy! Where the dragons (lizards and desert reptiles) lived, there will be lush pastures, and moist, healthy soil!

v. 8-- The highway is Jesus, and we can't "err therein" because He's guiding every detail of our lives!

v. 9-- We are walking in the Spirit free from the powers of Satan. He is powerless against us through Christ.

v. 10-- and Mankind will return to the total oneness with God that Adam enjoyed before the fall, and with it, the joy and gladness.

Chapter 36

v. 1-4-- The King of Assyria is Satan, and he sends messengers to us with much the same words--(v. 4)--"what confidence is this wherein thou trustest?"

v. 5-- He tells us that our confidence in God is vain, worthless, that He will never help us, and we have no power against him.

v. 6-- He's saying--"you can't trust your neighbor, or even your fellow Christians, because they'll double-cross you".
